The Poweshiek County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 8:30 a.m. Members present: Jacki Bolen and Jason Roudabush. Also present was Lora Wyckoff, Recorder.

Moved by Bolen, 2nd by Roudabush to approve agenda. 2 ayes. Motion carried.

Moved by Bolen, 2nd by Roudabush to approve June 29, 2026, board minutes. 2 ayes. Motion carried.

Moved by Bolen, 2nd by Roudabush to approve liquor license for Triple K Sips LLC, dba Lucky Wife Wine Slushies at 268 Center Point Drive, Montezuma on September 6, 2026. 2 ayes. Motion carried.

Moved by Bolen, 2nd by Roudabush to approve July 2, 2026 payroll for \$318,092.58. 2 ayes. Motion carried.

Moved by Bolen, 2nd by Roudabush to approve Cost Advisory Services, Inc. contract to provide professional consulting services to Poweshiek County for preparing annual cost allocation plan. 2 ayes. Motion carried.

Jennifer Anderson, Treasurer and Treasurer Office employees, Megan Tindle, Angie Rudd, and Jennifer Norris met with the board. Treasurer Anderson and her employees discussed the issue of being short-staffed and the workload within the motor vehicle office. Anderson stated she is close to filling the vacant position and would also like approval to hire an additional employee, staffing the motor vehicle department with four employees and the driver's license department with two employees. Anderson stated the position was removed because the offices were going to be combined, but after more consideration, there is no space big enough to combine all the Treasurer's offices. Board stated that money for an additional employee is not in the current budget, and they could not decide on an additional employee at this time. The Board will need time to consider the request for an additional employee but encouraged Anderson to continue to get the current vacant position filled soon. Information on revenue generated by motor vehicle and driver's license, as well as the number of individuals served in driver's license, was provided to the Board.

Lyle Brehm, Engineer, joined the meeting. Brehm discussed a request from an individual looking to purchase land located within the unincorporated village of Dresden, Deep River Township, to have the Plat vacated or to have the streets within the Plat vacated. Brehm stated this could be completed, but there is a process to follow, and he feels that until the individual actually owns the property, the county does not need to do anything at this time.

Roudabush has a conservation board meeting and Iowa Workforce meeting on Tuesday as well as a landfill meeting Wednesday.
